The focus of the seminar is on the relationship between risk based regulation and enforcement in the context of the credit crisis and the implications for regulatory reform.

Iain MacNeil is the Alexander Stone Professor of Commercial Law at the University of Glasgow. His teaching and research interests are primarily in the fields of company law, financial markets and related aspects of contract law. He is the director of the LLM Programs in Commercial Law and Corporate and Financial Law at the University of Glasgow. Before entering the academic world he worked for eight years with an investment bank in the City of London. Iain is a member of the editorial board of *the Capital Markets Law Review* and a committee member of the International Law Association's Committee on International Securities Regulation. He is the author of *An Introduction to the Law on Financial Investment* (Oxford, Hart, 2005) and has published widely on corporate governance and financial regulation
