**Regulation of executive remuneration: an empirical study of
the first three years of
a 'voting and disclosure' regime in Australia and the UK**

Speaker: Kym Sheehan

Kym Sheehan teaches at the University of Sydney and is completing a thesis at the University of Melbourne on executive remuneration.

In the seminar, Kym will present the findings of her empirical study of the 'voting and disclosure' regime on executive remuneration, which is part of her thesis. Legislation by the UK government in 2002 and the Australian government in 2004, targeted at improving executive remuneration practices in listed companies, was only partially successful in achieving the stated policy goals. The model of the regulatory framework for executive remuneration developed in the thesis, together with empirical evidence of its initial operation, explain why these reforms were unsuccessful. The study provides insights for the current round of government policy making and legislative reforms in executive remuneration.
